

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN KENTUCKY

- **Voter ID. BRING ID.** Election officials may require you to provide one of the following: Social Security card, driver's license or credit card. You may also provide evidence of your identity if election officials attest you are a personal acquaintance. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote through a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** When you move within the same precinct or to another precinct in the same county, you may vote after providing valid ID and making an affirmation and affidavit stating your change of address. If you move to a different county and fail to register to vote in the county of current residence prior to the date the registration books are closed, the law states you will have to vote by provisional ballot.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear any clothes or accessories that contain references to the candidates or parties. That conduct is prohibited by Kentucky law.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 300 feet of the polling place.
