

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN MICHIGAN

- **Voter ID. BRING PHOTO ID.** You must either provide photo ID or sign an affidavit before you will be allowed to vote. Acceptable forms of ID include a Michigan driver's license, any federal or state government-issued photo ID, valid U.S. passport, U.S. military ID, student ID or a valid tribal ID. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote through a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** If you registered to vote at your former residence and you moved within the same city or township, you can vote at your former polling place if you have not updated your registration.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear campaign materials. To avoid unnecessary delay, make sure you can easily cover or remove any clothing, button, sticker, etc., that supports a candidate or political party. You may not be allowed to vote until such materials are removed or covered.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 100 feet of the polling place.
