

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN MISSOURI

- **Voter ID. BRING ID.** Voters can present any one of the following forms of ID: a driver's license from Missouri or another state; an ID card issued by any federal, state or local government agency; a college ID from a school located in Missouri; a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that has your name and address; or a voter identification card. If you don't have identification, you have the right to vote if two election judges know you. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** If you did not register or update your registration by Oct. 8, you can update your registration and vote at your new polling place or the central polling location if you moved within the same county. If you moved to a different county or from out of state after Oct. 8, you can vote an absentee ballot after registering at the local election authority.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear campaign materials. To avoid unnecessary delay, make sure you can easily cover or remove any clothing, button, sticker, etc., that supports a candidate or political party. You may not be allowed to vote until such materials are removed or covered.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 100 feet of the polling place.
