

# YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NEW MEXICO

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID. All you need to do is tell the poll workers your name, year of birth and registered address, EXCEPT—if you registered by mail to vote for the first time, you must show a current photo ID with or without an address, or a utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, student ID card or other government document, including ID issued by an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo, that shows your name and address.
- **Change of residence.** You must have updated your registration before Oct. 7. If the address on your ID does not match the address listed on the voter rolls, you will not be permitted to vote.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear campaign materials. To avoid unnecessary delay, make sure you can easily cover or remove any clothing, button, sticker, etc., that supports a candidate or political party. You may not be allowed to vote until such materials are removed or covered.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 100 feet of the polling place.
