Improving Care, Improving Work

On Sept. 1, the Biden administration proposed the first-ever minimum staffing standards for nursing facilities that participate in Medicaid and Medicare. This historic development will improve care for the more than 1.1 million people per year who rely on nursing homes for care and improve working conditions for the more than 500,000 direct care staff members at those facilities.

The proposed regulation is an important first step in ensuring quality care and jobs. A projected 148 facilities in **South Carolina** would have to increase staffing, adding 259 registered nurses and 1,044 certified nursing assistants. Such an increase would reduce missed care and make working conditions in **South Carolina** nursing homes far less dangerous.

This rulemaking is a once-in-a-decade opportunity to set national staffing standards, but the for-profit nursing home companies and private equity investors are mobilizing to kill the rule. We can overcome that opposition with an even stronger show of support from workers, retirees and their families who would benefit from this rule if we can get it finalized.
